Tuesday 8th May 2018

Our Focus: Glockenspiel – See you Again and Stay With Me We also focussed on choosing a Mash -up to sing at the assembly that is significant to the occasion.

Why are focussing on this? To be able to perform 2 songs at our Leaver's Assembly in June.

Skills Developed today:

Timing- listening to the piano music and following along whilst reading our own music for glockenspiel. Being able to count the music.

Understanding key vocabulary: Crescendo,

Arrangement – including a variety of instruments to produce one piece of music.

Performance – How to conduct ourselves whilst performing, practising and resting.

Some pupils are working to play the melody and others working to play the chords of the music in order for our performance to sound amazing. The class are learning their notes for their own part of the performance and where the relevant notes are on the instrument.

What we enjoyed?

Playing glockenspiel.

Learning more difficult arrangements.

Learning the songs and hearing it come together with all the instruments. Singing along to mash-up examples and working together to choose an appropriate song.

Comparing our performance with the real song.

Primary 7a and 7b are going to use the glockenspiels in class as a Morning Challenge.

Our final song, 'From Now On' was the highlight of our practise as children know all the lyrics and most sing with enthusiasm. Actions are to be altered slightly as we decided there was too much of the same action.

Instrumentalists organised performance placements. Peer assessment highlighted that bass guitar sounded too harsh against the strings and therefore we would try the double bass in its replacements.
