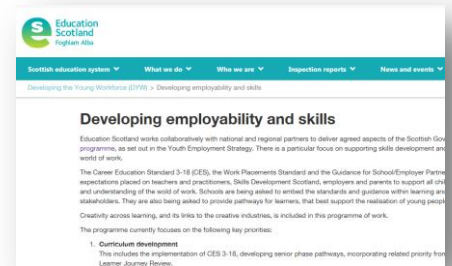

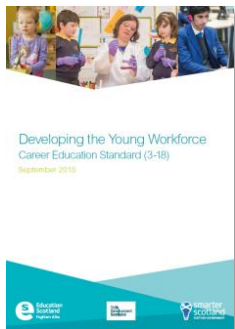

This document contains the entitlements and expectations as well as examples of 'I can' statements to support practitioners in developing career education from 3-18.

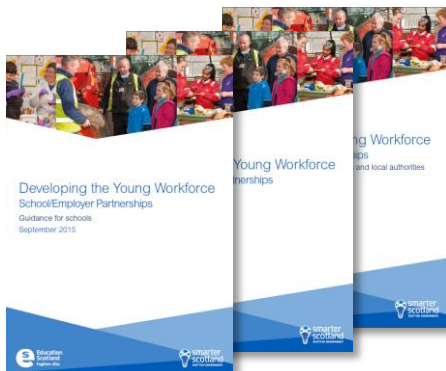
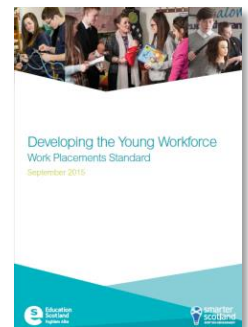
