Dear Parent/Carer

In February 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Kingsford Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Children who are proud to be part of Kingsford School and Nursery Class and who are friendly, respectful, increasingly motivated, and making steady progress in reading and writing.
- The hard working staff team across the primary stages who are keen to support improvement and deliver positive outcomes for children.
- The cohesive staff team in the nursery class who are successfully embracing new ways of planning, facilitating and supporting children's learning.
- The effectiveness of the nursery's outdoor learning environment in sustaining and extending children's curiosity and motivations to learn.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Aberdeen City Council.

- Improve the strategic leadership of the school to ensure that key elements of the work of the school fully reflect national guidance.
- Review the remits of the senior leadership team and take prompt action to update school policies and practices related to supporting children's wellbeing, equality and inclusion.
- Build on good practice to bring about consistently high-quality experiences and a sound understanding of the value of learning through play, particularly at the early primary stages.
- Continue as planned to refresh the school's curriculum rationale to better reflect the unique context of Kingsford Primary School and Nursery Class. This includes extending the range of partners to support the delivery of the curriculum, with a stronger emphasis on developing children's skills for learning, life and work.
- Establish an effective system for planning, tracking and monitoring attainment and children's wider achievements. Develop assessment approaches which are focussed on bringing about further improvement in children's attainment in literacy and numeracy.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
