**Dear Parent/Carer** 

In October 2022, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Cradlehall Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The inclusive, nurturing ethos across the school and nursery where children feel valued, supported and happy.
- Staff across the school and nursery who are undertaking professional learning and leading change in order to improve what children experience and achieve.
- The range of leadership opportunities and enriching experiences available to children which develop their skills and confidence well.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from The Highland Council.

- Continue to improve the quality and consistency of learning and teaching across the school and nursery. This includes plans to make better use of digital technology and outdoor learning spaces for all children, as well as improving the indoor environment and facilities for the nursery class.
- Senior leaders should develop a clearer way to track children's progress so that this information can be used to identify next steps more accurately at an individual, class and whole-school level.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4<sup>th</sup> edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
