Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Beauly Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The headteacher's strong leadership. She has a clear vision for the school and nursery and has created a culture of self-evaluation and improvement. She has established effective teamwork in the school and nursery, including all parents, resulting in a strong sense of community.
- The positive relationships between children and adults. This supports the caring ethos
 and culture in which children learn. Children enjoy coming to the school and nursery.
 They are friendly, show consideration for others, keen to learn and proud of their school.
- Children's enjoyment of quality outdoor experiences in the nursery. They are making good progress in their learning and development.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from The Highland Council.

- Continue to develop how the school uses information to identify, and take forward, relevant priorities for improvement.
- Improve further the quality of learning and teaching. This will ensure children benefit from high quality experiences throughout their time in school and nursery. Children should have increased opportunities to lead their learning.
- Continue to raise attainment. In doing so, develop how the school builds on what children already know ensuring this leads to learning of an appropriate level of difficulty.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
