Dear Parent/Carer

In March 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Barbara's Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Confident, able and articulate children who are well behaved and keen to learn. They are proud of their school and have a strong sense of belonging.
- Senior leaders provide strong leadership for the school, resulting in positive impact through the school's improvement processes.
- Staff who have created a welcoming, nurturing and caring ethos, where children's wellbeing is at the heart of the work of the school.
- Children make good progress in literacy and numeracy across the school.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from North Lanarkshire Council.

- The headteacher, supported by staff, should fully involve the whole school community in identifying improvements and leading change.
- Teachers need to develop consistently high-quality learning and teaching across the school. They should provide children with more opportunities to lead their own learning, building on their interests, knowledge and skills.
- Staff should meet better the learning and wellbeing needs of children through more effective planning and interventions. Senior leaders should organise appropriate professional learning to develop further teachers' skills to meet these needs.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
