Dear Parent/Carer

In December 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited New Machar Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Across the school and nursery, children are polite, well-mannered and attentive. They
 are welcoming and friendly, and enjoy sharing their learning with others. They are
 proud of their school.
- Across the school and nursery, nurturing relationships between the staff and children are based on mutual respect, understanding and kindness. This is supporting an inclusive culture across the school and nursery.
- Senior leaders and teacher's track children's progress over time well. They use
 information effectively to identify children who require additional support for learning. They
 plan and implement timely interventions to improve progress in learning for identified
 children.
- Nursery staff support children to settle quickly into the setting. They support children to develop confidence in their learning and play well.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Aberdeenshire Council.

- Across the school and nursery staff should work together to develop a shared understanding of high-quality learning and teaching. This will help to ensure appropriate pace and challenge to reflect the range of needs of all learners. Senior leaders should continue to monitor the quality of learning and teaching to ensure all children are making good progress in their learning.
- Across the school and nursery staff should continue to develop their approaches to
 observations and assessment. Staff should have a clear focus on learning and the specific
 skills children are developing and applying. This will help them to identify and plan clear
 next steps across the curriculum for all children.
- Continue to raise attainment in literacy and numeracy across the school and nursery.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare? Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
