
What do you know about Nicolaus Copernicus?





He was a Polish astronomer from the period of Renaissance.



He was born in a salesmen family, in this house, in Toruń.



He studied in Poland (Kraków) and Italy (Bologna, Padua and Ferrara).





This is how the Polish painter, Jan Matejko, depicted Copernicus in 1873.





Copernicus wrote in Latin as Latin was the language for writing scientific works at his time.



In 1543, he published his seminal study:

De revolutionibus orbium coelestium

(On the Revolutions of the Heavenly Spheres), in which he presented the heliocentric vision of the world.

A coin with the image of Copernicus








A Polish 1,000 zloty note which used to be in circulation
