Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Andrew's Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The welcoming, inclusive ethos where the school values are evident in the positive relationships across the school. Children make positive contributions to the work and life of the school and to the creative heritage of their community.
- The effective approaches to improving learning and teaching across the school. The headteacher has worked very well with staff to improve the quality and consistency of children's learning experiences at all stages.
- The whole school approach to improving attainment in writing. Children are highly motivated and enjoy writing. There is clear evidence of improved outcomes for children across the school.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Orkney Islands Council.

- Continue to raise the attainment of all children with a focus on improving outcomes in numeracy and mathematics.
- Continue to develop approaches to learning and teaching with an increased focus on providing children with increased challenge in their learning and developing their creativity skills.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
