Future Calling – Impact & Outcomes



Pupil Feedback

- 91% of respondents strongly agreed to the statement 'The project was relevant and useful.'
- 87% of respondents strongly agreed/agreed to the statement 'The project increased my interest in the subject matter of climate change.'
- 84% of respondents strongly agreed/agreed to the statement 'The project encouraged involvement and ownership of my own learning.'
- 90% of respondents rated their enjoyment of the project highly.

It made me feel like I need to try make a difference.

The project made me more aware of the world and that we can make a difference and if everyone does something small it would all add up to a nicer environment.

It made me think about climate change in a deeper perspective and think about what I could do to prevent it.

It made me feel more aware of everything going on in the world.
