Dear Parent/Carer

In January 2020, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Timothy's Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- St Timothy's is a welcoming school, where children, staff and visitors are respected. Staff have developed a nurturing school and nursery class where children and adults enjoy positive, caring relationships.
- Children who are keen to learn. They listen well in lessons, enjoy their achievements and respond well to praise and encouragement. They are confident to talk about their work and are proud of their school.
- Led by the senior leadership team, staff have developed an understanding of the school community. They are responsive to children's personal needs and provide high quality pastoral support across the primary stages and nursery class.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Glasgow City Council.

- To raise attainment, continue to improve learning, teaching and assessment to ensure all children receive consistently high quality experiences. In doing so, there is a need to better meet children's learning needs.
- Improve the curriculum to ensure all children make progress across all areas of their learning.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
