Dear Parent/Carer

In November 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Dalbeattie Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Positive, caring relationships between staff and children in the school and nursery.
- Children are proud to be part of Dalbeattie Primary School. They are kind to each other, polite and keen to learn.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Dumfries and Galloway Council.

- Put in place rigorous approaches to monitoring and evaluating the work of the school and nursery to ensure that children have better learning experiences.
- Across the school improve the quality and consistency of learning and teaching. Staff should provide more challenging tasks and activities so that children are more motivated, and attainment improves.
- Across the school and nursery, all staff need to improve approaches to assessment. They need to develop a clear assessment framework to help them gather reliable evidence about children's progress. They need to use data about children's progress better to help them to plan for children's learning effectively.
- In the nursery, staff need to improve the overall quality of learning and teaching. Staff should develop play environments which offer children stimulating learning experiences and ensure all children make very good progress in learning.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
