Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Tarbat Old Primary School and Nursery. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The acting headteacher has built quickly strong relationships across the school community. She has a clear aspirational vision for the school and nursery, and this is beginning to lead to improvement.
- There is a strong sense of community across the school and nursery. Staff and children are kind and respectful of each other. This creates a warm, inclusive learning environment.
- Teachers provide a range of learning experiences which engage children well. They support children to be active participants in their learning indoors and outdoors.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from The Highland Council.

- Across the school and nursery, develop leadership opportunities for all staff and children.
- Improve the quality of learning, teaching and assessment across the nursery. In doing so, it will be important for all staff to have a shared understanding of high-quality learning and teaching.
- Develop further approaches to checking children's progress across the nursery and school to raise attainment of all children.
- Across the school and nursery, staff should develop further the planning of learning experiences across all areas of the curriculum to ensure all children build on their prior learning.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
