Dear Parent/Carer

In March 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Carstairs Junction Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Children in the school and nursery are friendly and enthusiastic. They are proud of their school community and engage positively in their learning.
- All staff play an important role in the life of the school and nursery. Working well
 together, they create a highly inclusive learning environment for children that supports
 positive relationships and wellbeing.
- Senior leaders and staff track children's progress over time well. They use information
 effectively to identify children who require additional support for learning. They plan and
 implement timely interventions to improve progress in learning.
- Children in the nursery are making very good progress in their learning. They benefit
 from a range of stimulating nursery experiences which encourage them to be confident,
 independent, curious and creative learners.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from South Lanarkshire Council.

- Senior leaders and teachers should continue to improve the overall quality of learning and teaching across the school and supported classes. They should ensure all learning activities are planned at the right level of difficulty to enable all children to make appropriate progress in their learning.
- Senior leaders should continue to work with parents and partners to improve attendance across the school and supported classes.
- Practitioners should continue to develop the quality and consistency of observations to identify the skills children are developing across the curriculum. They should help children to understand what they have learned and what they might learn next.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
