Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Catherine's Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The strong start made by the headteacher in developing a culture of trust. In her short time in post, she has made decisions which are showing early signs of impact. The whole school community are very positive about the changes she has made.
- Children who are happy, polite and courteous and are keen to talk about their learning. They are very proud of their school.
- The whole staff team who work together to create a welcoming and inclusive ethos. The willingness of teachers to engage in professional learning in order to develop their practice and improve outcomes for children.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Glasgow City Council.

- Raise attainment in literacy and numeracy.
- Through improved planning and assessment, staff should track and measure children's progress more consistently.
- Refresh the school vision to reflect the unique context of the school. In doing so, promote leadership at all levels and empower the school community. Continue to support, encourage and facilitate children to make decisions about their own learning and the life of the school.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition</u>). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
