## Dear Parent/Carer

In June 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Hopeman Primary School Nursery. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and worked closely with the acting manager and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the setting's work.

- Children who are enthusiastic, motivated and very engaged in their nursery experiences. As a result, they make very good progress in their learning.
- Practitioners who have high expectations of children and themselves. As a team, they
  are passionate and demonstrate a notable level of commitment to successfully deliver
  high quality early learning experiences.
- High quality interactions between practitioners and children. Practitioners skilfully support, extend and challenge children's learning through a very effective blend of adult-initiated and child-led experiences. They are creative in how they motivate and excite children in their learning.
- The development and use of interesting approaches to plan and document children's learning. Practitioners support children well to be active participants in the process.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the acting manager and a representative from Moray Council.

 Build on existing links in the local community to provide opportunities for children to learn through real-life experiences and contribute as citizens of 21st century Scotland.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the setting's work using quality indicators from How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help learning and childcare settings, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved.
