Dear Parent/Carer

In February 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Nethermains Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Senior leaders work effectively with staff across the school to ensure children experience
 consistently positive relationships. Underpinned by the school's values, staff work together
 well to improve outcomes for children and families.
- Staff have a sound understanding of the wellbeing needs of all children across the school and nursery. As a result, children feel safe and well cared for.
- Children are confident, respectful and welcoming to visitors. They are proud of their school and engage well in their learning. In the nursery, children are motivated, creative and curious. They are eager to learn as they play.
- In the nursery, practitioners' use targeted approaches to support children's early communication and language. This is leading to children developing these skills well.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Falkirk Council.

- Continue to raise attainment in literacy and numeracy. Support teachers and practitioners to develop their confidence in assessing children's progress.
- At the primary stages, ensure that lessons are set at the correct level of difficulty and build on what children already know.
- In the nursery, continue to develop approaches to planning to have a clearer focus on the skills that children are learning.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
