Dear Parent/Carer

In April 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Netherthird Primary School and Early Childhood Centre. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Articulate and motivated children who are proud of their school and are enthusiastic learners.
- The supportive and caring ethos across the school and early childhood centre where all children are treated with respect and their views are valued.
- Opportunities for children to take part in interesting and motivating learning activities using meaningful contexts and good use of outdoor spaces.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from East Ayrshire Council.

- Continue to develop approaches to assessment and tracking of children's progress to ensure appropriate challenge for all learners.
- Continue to improve learning and teaching to ensure there is consistently high quality practice across all classes.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
