Establish an ESAS Action Group. Information on creating an action group is available through the ESAS dashboard. Review survey findings through the action group and create an action plan to address identified priorities. ESAS Activity	Possible link to MVP	Evidence	Quality indicators
Embed gender equality across the curriculum. Resources to support this are available on the ESAS dashboard.	Where MVP is established, additional staff can undertake MVP training to enrich learning and teaching, widen perspectives and build capacity. This helps ensure that gender equality and the prevention of gender-based violence are embedded consistently across the curriculum.	Increased awareness in classrooms and around the school, staff increased confidence gathered through ongoing feedback and evaluation.	1.1, 1.3

ESAS Activity	Possible link to MVP	Evidence	Quality indicators
Monitor and evaluate progress on an ongoing basis. Staff and learner surveys available through the ESAS dashboard can be used regularly to assess progress.	MVP mentors can support the review of findings and help ensure that young people's views inform decision-making and school improvement activity.	Minutes of meetings, pictures, witness statements, feedback, photos and engagement at events, evaluations from MVP sessions and school wide surveys to measure attitude change.
