



Communication with home has long been a strength of the school, enhanced by our Pupil Support Assistants (PSAs) who act as first point of contact for parents and carers and embed the nurturing ethos of the school.

One size fits one! We set out to find out what might work for individual families. Using surveys, phone calls and parental discussions we identified a number of possible learning activities and crucially, what the barriers to attending might be.


Get Going! Parents and young people working together to look at healthy food choices and portion control, as well as joint fitness sessions in the gym.

Learning workshops. Parents identified numeracy, ICT, fitness & swimming and learning a new language as areas of interest.



Raising Teens with Confidence. Our Lifelong Learning and Employability colleagues shared experiences, strategies and research with parents on how best to support young people.

Nurture Base 'Drop ins'. Parents are invited in to meet with staff to discuss progress or homework, for support in accessing services or just for a cup of tea and a chat.
