Dear Parent/Carer

In April 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Dunscore Pre School Centre. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and worked closely with the manager and practitioners.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the setting's work.

- A strong sense of community where practitioners foster caring relationships with children and families.
- Children who are happy, confident and developing resilience and perseverance. They
 come to nursery eager to learn.
- Well-planned visits to the local woods where children are developing a wide range of skills and knowledge.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the manager and a representative from Dumfries and Galloway Council.

- Practitioners should work with the local authority to develop effective systems for observation, planning and tracking with a stronger focus on children's learning.
- Practitioners need to put in place appropriate next steps for learning to ensure that all children make the best possible progress.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate some of the setting's work using four quality indicators from How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help early learning and childcare settings, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each setting, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish early learning and childcare settings are doing.
