Dear Parent/Carer

In February 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Blairhall Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Well behaved, polite children who enjoy active learning experiences and who are making good progress in their learning.
- The leadership of the headteacher, ably supported by the two acting deputes. The team has successfully led the school in improving the ethos, learning and teaching and children's attainment and achievement.
- The whole staff team commitment to professional learning which is supporting their focus on improving outcomes for children.
- Children in the nursery class benefit from a well-planned learning environment and caring support. They are settled in their nursery, and enjoy their time learning indoors and out.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Fife Council.

- Continue to build on good practice to ensure children experience high quality learning and teaching across a relevant curriculum which offers children progression in all areas. In doing so, ensure all children attain appropriate levels.
- Staff in the nursery should continue to improve their use of tracking systems to inform future planning of learning and appropriate intervention and support.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
