Dear Parent/Carer

In April 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Braidburn School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and young people and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Staff and partners across the school and nursery use daily routines and structures effectively to support children and young people participate in learning.
- Children and young people reflect well the school and nursery values during learning activities. Staff support children and young people to build their independence and to develop and grow.
- Children and young people make positive progress with developing a range of communication skills. This supports them to provide their views, make choices and be active participants during the school day.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from The City of Edinburgh Council.

- Senior leaders and staff in the school and nursery should ensure that all children and young people experience consistently high-quality learning experiences matched appropriately to their needs.
- Senior leaders and staff to continue to develop their use of data. This will help them know how well children and young people make progress during their time at the nursery and school.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare? Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
