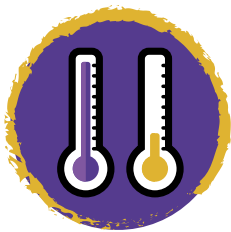


SEPSIS. HOW TO SPOT IT.
