If you've a combination of these symptoms, seek urgent medical advice. Early recognition and prompt treatment does save lives.



very high or low temperature



uncontrolled shivering



confusion



passing less urine than normal



blotchy or cold arms or legs

In children and babies, sepsis symptoms may also include:



Fast or difficulty breathing



Rapid heartbeat



Feeling dizzy or faint



Extreme weakness, fussiness or poor feeding



Lethargy or difficulty waking
