Dear Parent/Carer

In June 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Aultmore Park Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The headteacher and staff work well together to ensure a calm, purposeful and welcoming learning environment across the primary school.
- Children are polite, well-mannered and take great pride in their school and language communication resource (LCR). They talk enthusiastically about their learning and enjoy the additional activities that staff make available beyond the classroom.
- Staff work very well with a range of supportive partners. This is helping children to understand their local community and to develop effectively skills for learning, life and work. This is also providing groups of children with valuable learning experiences beyond the school.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Glasgow City Council.

- Continue to raise the attainment of all children at all stages of the school and LCR. Senior leaders are working well to improve children's attendance and late-coming. Continuing to improve these areas of the school's work is crucial to ensuring that each child has the opportunity to reach their potential and be more ambitious.
- Senior leaders and teachers should ensure that they continue to improve the quality of teaching and maximise available learning time for children in all classes over the school day. More streamlined routines in classes are required to help all children to be ready to learn
- As planned across the school and LCR, senior leaders should embed systems to monitor children's attainment across all areas of their learning. They should capitalise on these systems as a base for regular conversations to monitor how well they support children to achieve their very best.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
