










This led us to introduce whole school topics and Make A Difference (MAD) groups to provide guaranteed, rich learning experiences for all. Our Grange Learner Qualities help everyone to understand the learning process and their development as a Great Grange Learner. This understanding also comes from the shared language of learning and progress provided by our Learning Ladders which outline the success criteria and what a year's progress looks like from nursery to P7. They are used to carefully track individual progress and to plan responsively for support and challenge to raise attainment for all.

Our staff have developed a shared language of high-quality learning and teaching, The Grange Top 10, which they use to self-evaluate and to identify areas for improvement. This informs our professional learning which in recent years has focused on questioning, co-creation of success criteria and differentiation. Teachers work collaboratively in Impact Teams to reflect upon and improve their practice using the 'Plan Do Study Act' cycle to ensure no teacher is left behind. We now have consistently high standards of learning and teaching across our school and collective teacher efficacy which drives us to keep improving.
