Dear Parent/Carer

In March 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Salen Primary School and Pre-Five Unit – Bun-Sgoil agus Sgoil-Àraich an t-Sàilein. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The headteacher and staff, across the school and pre-five unit, who work well together to create positive, respectful and trusting relationships with children, parents and the community. There is a welcoming, caring and inclusive ethos across the whole school as a result.
- Children who are proud of their school and pre-five unit. They are polite, well-mannered and welcoming to visitors. They engage well in their learning.
- Staff within the sgoil-àraich who use a range of total immersion approaches to support children's increasing fluency.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and representatives from Argyll and Bute Council.

- Develop clear processes to support the identification, delivery and review of improvement priorities in the school and pre-five unit.
- Improve approaches to planning children's learning experiences in the school and pre-five unit. Staff should include children more fully in planning learning.
- Improve the standards of learning, teaching and assessment across the school. Ensure that all learning activities across the school are matched effectively to children's needs. Children need to be better supported and challenged in their learning.
- Raise attainment in literacy and numeracy across the school. In doing so, teachers need to develop a better understanding of national standards.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
