## Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Lairhillock Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Led effectively by the headteacher, the staff team within the school have developed effective ways to check the progress children are making in their learning.
- Children's achievements are effectively recognised and celebrated throughout the school and nursery class. Children are valued members of their school community.
- The quality of the nursery environment both indoors and out. Children are motivated and engage well in the range of stimulating play experiences.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Aberdeenshire Council.

- Continue to develop approaches to planning, tracking and observing learning in the nursery class, to ensure all children make the best possible progress.
- Continue to develop approaches to learning and teaching to ensure all learning across the school is well-paced and provides all children with the appropriate level of support and challenge.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4<sup>th</sup> edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
