**Dear Parent/Carer** 

In November 2022, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Rosebank Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the work of the nursery and school.

- Staff develop positive, nurturing relationships with children across the nursery and school. They support children to feel cared for and safe.
- Children across the nursery and school are polite, friendly and keen to learn.
- Leadership at all levels is effective in the nursery. This results in positive experiences for children and their active engagement in their learning.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and representatives from The Highland Council.

- Improve children's progress and attainment across the curriculum, with a clear focus on literacy and numeracy at the primary stages.
- Improve the quality and consistency of learning, teaching and assessment across the school. Ensure that all children build on prior learning and experience appropriate pace and challenge.
- Develop teachers' skills in the use of data to inform effective planning. Staff should work together more effectively to develop a shared understanding of national standards.
- Involve all children more fully in their learning and the wider life of the school. Children should have increased opportunities to develop a range of skills and contribute to decision-making about issues that affect them.
- Building on existing strengths, continue to develop approaches to planning in the nursery to support all children to make improved progress.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four guality indicators from How good is our school? (4<sup>th</sup> edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
