Dear Parent/Carer

In October 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Levenvale Primary School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The strong sense of community across the school and early learning and childcare centre (ELC). The wellbeing of children and their families lies are at the heart of its work. This is leading to positive outcomes for children, and families.
- Children who are confident and friendly and show kindness towards each other resulting in an inclusive welcoming, happy atmosphere across the school and nursery.
- Children who are motivated to learn and respond well to opportunities to work independently and as part of a group to take responsibility for their own learning.
- The quality of the play areas and learning hubs within the early learning and childcare centre and school and the range of experiences beyond the school and ELC support children well to gain real-life learning skills.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from West Dunbartonshire Council.

- There is a need to ensure the headteacher and all staff have an accurate picture of the school and nursery class strengths and the areas which require improvement.
- Senior leaders should develop more opportunities for children across the school campus, to contribute to improvement and develop their leadership skills.
- Develop the curriculum further across the school and nursery to ensure all children benefit from progressive learning.
- Continue to raise children's attainment in literacy and numeracy to ensure all children make the best possible progress.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
