Dear Parent/Carer

In June 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Mary's Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Confident and happy children who are proud of their school and use their school values very well to shape their learning and relationships.
- The very effective senior leadership team who, together with all staff from across the school, have high aspirations for their children. They have created a nurturing and inclusive learning environment where children thrive and achieve.
- Challenging and interesting learning activities with high-quality support for children. As a result, children are making very good progress in their literacy and numeracy.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Renfrewshire Council

• Continue to improve approaches to learning and teaching with a focus on planning activities that take account of the different strengths and needs of children.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u> and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
