**Dear Parent/Carer** 

In January 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Alloa Academy. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and young people and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The headteacher is well established and respected across the school community. He provides effective leadership in motivating and empowering staff at all levels to improve learners' experiences. This is developing a shared ownership and clear understanding of improvement priorities with staff, young people, parents and partners.
- There is a calm and supportive learning environment throughout the school, built on strong and mutually respectful relationships between staff and young people. Young people are polite, attentive and ready to learn.
- There is a very nurturing ethos, with care for each individual young person. This includes a strong commitment to support young people who are care experienced. Learners and their families have a strong sense of belonging in the school and young people are well supported in moving forward into positive destinations.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Clackmannanshire Council.

- Senior leaders should support staff to use a range of appropriate evidence to measure the impact of improvement actions.
- Staff should consider how to improve the pace and depth of learning. Staff should use assessment evidence to plan appropriately challenging learner experiences across curriculum areas.
- Staff should focus on improving the quality of young people's attainment, especially as young people progress through the school.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4<sup>th</sup> edition</u>). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
