## Dear Parent/Carer

In March 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Annette Street Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The senior leadership team and staff who have successfully created a welcoming, nurturing and inclusive ethos. Children and families new to the school are warmly welcomed and supported. As a result, the school is held in high regard by the whole school community.
- Children who are polite, respectful and enjoy learning. They engage confidently with each other, staff and visitors to the school.
- The highly effective partnership working which enhances and broadens children's experiences. This also includes the creative and successful use of local places of interest.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Glasgow City Council.

- As planned, develop further the curriculum to ensure children experience progression, depth and breadth in learning.
- To secure continuous improvement develop more robust approaches to self-evaluation.
- Continue to develop approaches to tracking and monitoring children's progress. To support this to be robust and reliable, continue to develop approaches to assessment and moderation.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
