## Dear Parent/Carer

In September 2024, an inspector from Education Scotland visited Sunshine Playschool. During the visit, I talked to parents/carers and worked closely with the manager and practitioners.

The inspector found the following strengths in the setting's work.

- The leadership of the manager and her focus on professional learning. As a result, the staff team continue to deepen their knowledge to provide good quality early learning and childcare.
- The positive relationship between staff, children and parents. The manager and practitioners have created a friendly, welcoming and nurturing playschool. This approach reassures children and helps them to settle well and feel secure.
- The range of children's experiences provided both indoors and outdoors. The manager and practitioners ensure these experiences take good account of how children learn.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the manager and a representative from Angus Council.

- The team should make more effective use of the evidence they gather to determine what is working well in the setting and what could improve further. This should inform future priorities that support the improvement of the playschool at a quicker pace.
- Increase the range of resources provided over the week to extend children's imaginative play and problem solving skills. This should give children greater levels of challenge in their play.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate some of the setting's work using four quality indicators from How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help early learning and childcare settings, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each setting, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish early learning and childcare settings are doing.
