Dear Parent/Carer

In January 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Kilninver Primary School and Pre-Five Unit. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The headteacher and staff across the school and early learning and childcare setting (ELC) have created a calm, inclusive learning environment. Children feel cared for and happy as a result.
- Children are enthusiastic and eager to learn. They are polite, friendly and have a well-developed understanding of their own wellbeing.
- Children in the ELC are motivated and engaged in their learning. Skilled practitioners help them to make good progress in their learning. They provide stimulating learning experiences that build on children's interests and promote curiosity.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Argyll and Bute Council.

- The headteacher should use national guidance to strengthen the approaches for school improvement.
- The staff team at the primary stages should work together to improve children's progress and attainment across the curriculum, particularly in writing.
- The headteacher should work with teachers to develop greater consistency in learning, teaching and assessment. They should ensure the pace of learning is brisker and lessons and activities are well-matched to meet all children's needs. This will help children to make the best possible progress.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school?</u> (4th edition) and <u>How good is our early learning and childcare?</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
