Dear Parent/Carer

We are trying out some new approaches to inspection. You can find out about our engagement with stakeholders and the approaches we are trying out as a result on our website: [Future approaches to inspection and review](#). The inspection of your child's school was carried out using one of our new approaches.

In January 2018, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited your child's school for a total of two days. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff. We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate aspects of the quality of leadership and children's achievements.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The good team work among all staff across the school and nursery as they work together to make improvements to children's learning experiences.
- The very high quality learning environment which is provided by the new school building.
- Approaches taken in the nursery to support the development of children's literacy and numeracy skills.
- Children's enthusiasm for learning and their keenness to take on further challenges in the school.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Perth and Kinross Council.

- Develop a wider range of approaches to self-evaluation for improvement and ensure that these are used consistently across the school and nursery to bring about improvements.
- Continue to improve staff's skills in analysing a range of data and evidence to raise children's attainment further.

We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate some quality indicators from [How good is our school? \(4<sup>th</sup> edition\)](#). Quality indicators help schools, education authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers evaluations of quality indicators to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
