Dear Parent/Carer

In September 2023, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Buchlyvie Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The very warm and positive relationships between adults and children in Buchlyvie Primary School. These relationships help children to be happy, confident and independent learners.
- Teachers' approaches to planning children's learning across all curriculum areas. They take effective account of the multi-stage composite classes and ensure children's learning is meaningful and relevant for them.
- The high standards of attainment in literacy and numeracy. The headteacher and all staff carefully review children's progress to identify where children need further help and put effective support in place timeously.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Stirling Council.

- Continue to embed and develop consistent approaches to learning, teaching and assessment across the school.
- As planned, continue to implement approaches to raise attainment for all children across all curricular areas.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
