Dear Parent/Carer

In March 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited St Monica's Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Well behaved, courteous children, growing in confidence. Children work well together
 with classmates and staff, and are articulate in talking about their learning and progress
 with visitors.
- The school's proactive approach to professional learning, including a focus on using attainment data to inform decisions. Staff have access to high quality information provided by their local authority and partner agencies, and have been supported by an effective collaboration with a university and neighbouring authority.
- Strong, resilient and resourceful leadership from the headteacher. Supported well by promoted staff, the headteacher has achieved important progress in key areas of the school's work. These achievements position the school well for continuing improvements in its performance.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from North Lanarkshire Council.

- Staff should continue to improve the overall quality of children's learning and attainment. Improvements should include a more stimulating, greater focus on play based approaches for younger children, and more opportunities for children to develop as independent learners and as leaders.
- Senior leaders should continue to encourage all staff to take on aspects of leadership
 in the school, in line with professional expectations and national standards. Staff should
 adopt more effective approaches to sharing good practice at all stages, including
 through peer observation.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
