Dear Parent/Carer

In September 2022, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Slains Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The acting headteacher, teachers and support staff have established a caring and nurturing ethos at Slains Primary School. There are warm and supportive relationships across the school. All children are polite and respectful to their classmates and adults.
- The whole school approach to improving numeracy is beginning to have a positive impact on children's interest, confidence and progress in this curriculum area.
- Children enjoy being outdoors. The school's location and the extensive outdoor areas offer potential for rich learning opportunities across the curriculum.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Aberdeenshire Council.

- The acting headteacher and staff should develop further their approaches to prioritising and directing improvements to ensure all children reach their full potential.
- Improve approaches to learning, teaching and assessment. This should include developing, as a staff, a shared understanding of how they plan learning that allow children to build on previous learning. In doing this, staff need to develop an understanding of national standards.
- There is a need to better meet the learning needs of all children.
- Improve children's progress and attainment across the curriculum, particularly in reading and writing.
- Ensure all children have opportunities for learning across all areas of the curriculum.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition</u>). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
