Dear Parent/Carer

In June 2019, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Arinagour Primary School and Pre-Five Unit. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Children who are enthusiastic and engaged in their learning. They are respectful and supportive of each other in learning situations and in social contexts.
- The positive relationships across the school community where children and staff feel valued and included.
- The programme of residential trips to the mainland and links with other remote schools. These learning experiences give children the opportunities not readily available on the island to develop skills for life and prepare them for transition to secondary education.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Argyll and Bute Council.

- Review learning and teaching methodology to introduce greater challenge across the curriculum and increase the pace of progress of learning.
- Offer more opportunities for children to lead their own learning developing independent learning skills to raise attainment for all learners.
- Develop outdoor learning to reflect the unique context of Arinagour Primary School using the rich natural environment to enhance children's learning experiences.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
