Dear Parent/Carer

In January 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited King's Park Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Staff have created a calm, engaging and inclusive learning environment. Children for whom English is not their first language are supported very well to settle and make strong connections across the school. This supports children to engage very well with their learning and make good progress.
- The senior leadership team has created a culture which supports and encourages strong teamwork and creative approaches. Teachers are enthusiastic about developing their own practice and improving outcomes for all children. This is leading to consistent approaches to high quality teaching and learning.
- Staff and children make very effective use of digital technology across the school. This is helping teachers to provide motivating, relevant learning experiences and helping children to take a lead role in their own learning.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Glasgow City Council.

• Teachers should ensure learning activities are sufficiently challenging and set at the right level of difficulty. This will help ensure children make the best possible progress.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from <u>How good is our school? (4th edition)</u>. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
