Introduction

The following notes and images are to support and illustrate the National Improvement Hub resource "Gairloch High School – Developing fluency and literacy in Gaelic in young people". The resource and this appendix cover learning and teaching in Gaelic Medium Education (GME) and Gaelic Learner Education (GLE).



Film G and other partnerships

Gairloch High School has been involved with FilmG – the Gaelic Short Film Competition for many years. FilmG has allowed learners to develop creativity skills and to learn about positive destinations and young people have had annual success in the FilmG competition.

Spòrs Gàidhlig events have given young people the opportunity to explore how Gaelic can be used in environments outside of school. In partnership with Comunn na Gàidhlig (CnaG) all pupils are offered activities that enables pupils to use Gaelic in fun, social settings beyond the classroom.

Young people perform well at the National Mod in a range of competitions. Pupils from Gairloch High have won national writing competitions in on an annual basis since 2018.

Regular Talk Exercises in Gaelic Learner Education

Young people in both GME and GLE focus on developing their use of Gaelic language in a range of social contexts. In GLE this is achieved via a weekly conversation with a peer, revising and reviewing basic vocabulary – the resources for this allow for self-directed and differentiated learning through conversation with a variety of support methods including English prompts, Gaelic key word prompts, and full Gaelic key word prompts. This approach supports the development of vocabulary, skills and grammar, leading to increased fluency and confidence.. The following examples are for S1 and S3 learners.


Regular engagement with Gaelic media in Gaelic Medium Education

Young people in GME engage weekly with Gaelic language media, developing literacy skills in a progressive manner, for example through writing summaries after listening to content from TV, Radio and on-line sources. They share their work in on-line digital spaces with peers, and this peerassessment promotes increased collaboration.
