## Benefits of a Dog Visit

- Supports communication, social interaction and confidence.
- Can become a familiar companion who listens without judgement.

- Can provide emotional comfort and help to decrease anxiety.
- Teaches compassion towards and responsible behaviour around dogs.



## Feedback from Participants

" $R$ was selected as she has autism and really struggles in social settings. She avoided reading and would never read aloud in class. She is very low in confidence and mood, and often disengages and lacks focus. She had started to self-harm. She continues to read to Willow over break time and engages well. She will often talk to the dog and owner about her feelings. After being with Willow, she engages in class and will gladly read aloud. She is more engaged in texts and likes to choose novels to read."
> "Overall, a really positive experience.....The dogs (and owners) were brilliant."
"Most significant development was seen with one P7 boy, who at first would not read out loud at all. By session 3, he was reading confidently out loud for the FIRST time in P7. Our 2 volunteers have been exceptional in every way - both understanding, empathetic and willing to adapt, sometimes at the very last minute. We can't thank them enough".
"The children were especially happy to see Finn again as they just love sitting and reading to him. His gentleness has a calming effect on them so that they relax and enjoy reading to him, which in front of their classmates they would not do. Gradually we can see them becoming more fluent in their reading we need more Therapets, especially as many children's literacy has suffered due to the pandemic."
