The **Improving Gender Balance Self-Evaluation Framework** is designed to support early learning and childcare establishments, primary, additional support needs and secondary settings to reflect, discuss and plan for an ongoing and sustainable approach to improving gender balance and equalities for all learners. The self-evaluation framework can be worked through in order or you can focus on an area that is of particular interest to you.

Data is essential for identifying and planning for next steps. We have developed two data guides, one for **primary and ELC settings** and one for **secondary settings**, to help practitioners gather and analyse a range of data to support planning approaches to address persistent gender imbalances.
