Dear Parent/Carer

In January 2025, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Bellyeoman Primary School and Nursery. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the acting headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Children in the school and nursery who are welcoming, respectful, well-behaved and eager to learn.
- The respectful and caring relationships between children and adults across the school and nursery. This nurturing ethos supports children in the school and nursery to make good progress in their learning.
- The opportunities children have to achieve through leadership roles, activities and committee membership. These opportunities develop well children's teamwork, citizenship, responsibility and confidence.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Fife Council.

Senior leaders, teachers and practitioners should review and improve approaches to the
assessment, planning and moderation of learning and play. They should ensure that all
children participate in learning that offers sufficient and appropriate challenge. Staff should
continue to make better links with documents that illustrate national standards of
attainment.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare? Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
