Online Team Teaching - 'Live Lessons' Supporting Teachers to Deliver Gaelic in the Primary School



To motivate pupils and support teachers to deliver Gaelic confidently as L3 by facilitating fun and engaging online team-teaching. Teachers receive live, on the job professional learning in Gaelic and language pedagogy and lead the learning for chunks of the live lessons. This building of confidence then enables teachers to consolidate the language learning in their own class time using suggested follow-up resources and activities. So why this model?

- To increase teacher confidence in languages and language pedagogy.
- To provide on the job professional learning to alleviate workload pressures.
- To demonstrate in real-time what progression in language looks like.
- To help teachers make the time for languages in a crowded curriculum.



Because I was learning in real time with real pupils so putting new learning in place while being supported rather than an afterschool session and then trying to do it all myself.

We offer Gaelic L3 courses to P4-7 classes. We provide a 6-week Gaelic Absolute beginners' course and a 6 week Gaelic extension course . Both these courses are offered twice over the school year which provides two opportunities to participate.

During these lessons, teachers learn alongside their pupils in real time and lead language learning games in their own class.

Learning with the class and developing the confidence to pronounce vocabulary correctly phonics was a huge part of this.

I would love if these could be implemented for all levels for the whole school year!!

Being committed to a weekly slot ensured my class engaged with learning language this as is something that sometimes slipped from the timetable. It was a relief to have the correct pronunciation demonstrated to the class.

I find it far more beneficial to learn by doing, rather than talking about it or simply being given ideas but not shown how to use them and incorporate them into your routines.

- 93% of teachers agreed that pupil engagement with language learning is more positive. 94% of teachers agreed that their pupils' confidence had increased. 91% of teachers agreed that the pupils in their classes had made steady progress in Gaelic.

How?

Instruction provided by an expert and then games led by myself meant it was a really interactive experience and rewarding for the pupils.

I liked the weekly input. Games were brilliant, children were so engaged and even my less confident pupils had a go. We really liked that we were working with classes all over the country.

How did we deliver the live lessons?



• We use Microsoft Glow Teams to deliver the lessons. This means all teachers across Scotland can become a member of the Team and access the lessons and resources.

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- Each lesson lasts 40 minutes. minutes.
- We offered the same lesson twice weekly to provide flexibility for attending.
- The lesson structure alternates between short bursts of direct teaching from the online teacher followed by the class teachers leading their own class in a game.
- We provide suggested follow-up activities and resources to consolidate the learning.
