Dear Parent/Carer

In May 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Elrick School and Nursery Class. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- Positive, caring, nurturing relationships are a strength of the school and nursery. This
 underpins learning and teaching. As a result, children are happy, confident and eager to
 learn.
- Children's experiences are supported and enhanced through effective work with the community and partners.
- Senior leaders have promoted shared leadership across the school. As a result, staff, practitioners and children feel confident and motivated to initiate change. These changes lead to improvements in the work of the school.
- The quality of the nursery environment offers rich learning experiences for children to support them to develop skills across the curriculum.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Aberdeenshire Council.

- Senior leaders should continue to extend opportunities for children, staff and parents to plan, lead and review aspects of school improvement. It is important that staff are able to demonstrate fully that their actions are achieving the desired result.
- Staff across the school and nursery should improve approaches to the planning and tracking of learning, teaching and assessment for all children. This should support continued improvements in attainment at all stages, particularly in writing.
- Practitioners in the nursery should develop approaches to monitor the progress of children over time.



We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using four guality indicators from How good is our school? (4th edition) and How good is our early learning and childcare?. Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
