Dear Parent/Carer

In September 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Moray Primary School. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and children and worked closely with the headteacher and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.

- The positive relationships staff build with children and their families and the approaches to supporting their wellbeing. Children learn within a highly inclusive environment, they are motivated and very engaged learners who are proud of their school.
- Teachers' skilled use of digital technology to support and enhance children's learning. Children are developing their digital skills well and enhancing their learning as a result.
- The wide range of opportunities children have to achieve through clubs, groups, activities and committee roles. These experiences help children to develop successfully their teamwork, citizenship, creative, sporting and organisational skills.
- In the enhanced provision class, children have valuable opportunities to be involved in the life and work of the school and learn alongside their peers. This is supporting them well to make good progress in their learning and wellbeing.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the headteacher and a representative from Falkirk Council.

- Continue to implement new approaches to planning children's learning and making effective use of assessment information to measure children's progress. This will enable staff to evidence clearly the impact of interventions on children's attainment.
- As planned, staff should identify and plan learning for children who require further challenge. This will help all children to receive learning that is set at the right level of difficulty and make the best possible progress.

We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the school's work using quality indicators from [How good is our school? \(4th edition\)](#). Quality indicators help schools, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved. Following the inspection of each school, the Scottish Government gathers details of our evaluations to keep track of how well Scottish schools are doing.
