Dear Parent/Carer

In June 2024, a team of inspectors from Education Scotland visited Rosetta Early Learners. During our visit, we talked to parents/carers and worked closely with the manager and staff.

The inspection team found the following strengths in the setting's work.

- The warm, welcoming and inclusive ethos which helps children feel safe, respected and valued. The very positive relationships between children, staff and parents contribute to the strong sense of community across the setting.
- The skilled manager and staff who work well together and with the parents' committee and partners to secure continuous improvement within the setting.
- The stimulating learning experiences which promote well children's creativity and interest in learning.

The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the manager/head of setting and a representative from Scottish Borders Council.

- Continue to develop further approaches to planning and recording children's learning. This should fully involve children and parents to help children make the best possible progress across their learning.

We gathered evidence to enable us to evaluate the setting's work using quality indicators from [How good is our early learning and childcare?](#) Quality indicators help learning and childcare settings, local authorities and inspectors to judge what is working well and what needs to be improved.
